Women develop cooking skills and learn about financially sustainable nutrition in the 'Food for Thought' program.

Globally, one in three women will experience physical or sexual violence in their lifetime.

Through this project, Food for
Thought, the Zahra Foundation and
the Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders Inc
in Australia, assist women who have
suffered from violence to build up
their social connections, confidence
and ultimately their resilience.

The educational program taught women from diverse cultures and ethnicities how to cook and how to eat nutritiously in a budget-friendly way while engaging with and learning from one another.



Adelaide Flinders are about to run their third session of Food for Thought in the second series this year. This series is being led by Susan Mac Donald and has had 8-9 participants at each session.

I am so pleased that so many club members have volunteered to assist with the sessions and, we have all enjoyed ourselves and appreciated the chance to meet and talk with the ZAHRA participants.

Of course, we can only plan from session to session as we prepare to respond to new Health guidelines and restrictions but feedback from the participants is so positive that it is pleasing that we have been able to get this far. Our next series is scheduled for October.
