Toast a member returns

Sharon Vale one of our newer members toasted Jill Welsh one of our longest servicing members at our September meeting

Jill Welsh (nee Boyden) was born in Melbourne on the 7th November 1936, the second of three children born to Rene and Syd Boyden. Contrary to popular opinion, I have it on very good authority that she was NOT born with either a raffle ticket or movie ticket in her hands at that time! When I asked Jill what her full name was, expecting her to say that she was Jillian something Boyden, she replied that her father had told her when asked, "you don't need a middle name so we didn't give you one. You are just Jill, like the racehorse called Just Jill!"

Jill was educated at Penleigh School, a small Presbyterian ladies college where she completed her schooling at the end of year 11. During that time she played tennis and basketball, and in later years she played a little squash. When she left school Jill went to Business College for a year and at the end of that time was offered 3 positions of employment. Jill decided to accept the position of junior secretary at Henry Berry & Co, a wholesale grocery.

On a visit to Philip Island over the Easter weekend of 1955 Jill aged 18 years, met Murray Welsh. A romance blossomed and the rest is history! They were engaged when Jill was 19 and a half, but, on her father's insistence they were not allowed to get married until Jill was 21. On 1st February 1958, 3 months after her 21st birthday Jill and Murray were married at Glen Iris. They now have 2 sons and are proud grandparents to 4 grandchildren.

Jill was 24 years old when Tupperware made its appearance in Victoria in 1961. Up until this time there had been no such thing as "direct selling" in Australia. By chance Jill was invited by her friend Judy to come to a morning tea with her, an invitation which would change Jill's life. The person hosting the morning tea was running very late and everything was a bit of a shambles with young children running amok. But eventually the host arrived and displayed her wares, namely Tupperware! Judy was immediately very impressed with the quality of the product and how superbly made it was and said enthusiastically to Jill "This product is going to be huge. We have to get into this." When Jill approached Murray about starting a business selling Tupperware by party plan he was reluctant as he did not want his wife working, especially when as they had a young son. But we all know just how persuasive Jill can be and before long she had talked him around.

Both women starting selling, and in a very short time Jill had become extremely successful. Murray then started learning the ropes and was being groomed for the role of Managing Director. A year after getting Tupperware started in Victoria Jill and Murray moved to South Australia in 1962 to expand the business there. Jill was a distributor for 20 years and was one of Tupperware's top sellers both in Australia and in the world! During this time both Jill and Murray attended at least 2 overseas conferences a year and visited many parts of the world. Their travels took them to New Zealand, Asia, Morocco, UK, Japan, Malaysia and Europe. The place that holds a special place in Jill's heart is Positano in Italy.

Jill became well known and sought after for her sales ability and in 1981 was approached by the German company Miele to showcase their range of whitegoods in SA. At a showroom in Melbourne Street, North Adelaide Jill spent 3 years developing and getting the products known and then successfully into retail outlets.

In 1986 Crabtree and Evelyn, an English company which produced and sold exclusive high-end women's toiletries, approached Jill to promote and sell their products in South Australia, which she did very successfully for 6 years.

Jill met a woman at dinner one night who was talking about Zonta and who invited her to a Zonta meeting in March 1983. It was hardly a meeting at all as it was the night of Ash Wednesday when devastating bushfires raged out of control in and around the Adelaide Hills. Jill said it was a very strange meeting which ended very early as everyone just wanted to get back home.

Not to be deterred Jill attended the next meeting in April, which was also attended by a Zontian from Bendigo - Val Sarah! Jill was so impressed by Val who was such an inspirational speaker, and who also served as an International President, that she knew there and then that she wanted to join Zonta.

Jill was inducted in September 1983. She served as President from 1984-1986 and during this time won 3 international awards. She has also served as Vice President, member of the Board and Chair of both the Nominating and the Membership committees for 15 years. Jill is famous for her very successful fundraising film nights which she has organised and held every year bar one, of the 38 years she has been with Zonta. And it was only COVID19 that could manage to put a stop to her plans to hold one in 2020! Jill also puts her sales skills to good use in Zonta by selling movie tickets, raffle tickets, cook books and enlisting new members.

When I asked Jill what she attributes to her being so successful in sales over the years she replied "It is quite simple. It is very easy to sell a product you believe in and are passionate about. That was the case with Tupperware, Miele and Crabtree and Evelyn and also Zonta!" she said.

Would you please all join me in raising your glass to toast the inimitable Jill Welsh who is a much valued and committed member of Adelaide Flinders who has achieved so much in her time with the club. Tonight marks exactly 38 years to the day since she was first inducted into Zonta. To the right is a photo of Jill doing what we know her well for – introducing a prospective new member to the club

New Members Speak - How are we doing?

Quality membership is at the heart of who we are, and it drives what we can do, locally and internationally to support women and girls. It is both a challenge and an opportunity.

To be effective, clubs cannot thrive without healthy boards, committees and communication and equally members will not stay unless these positive elements exist in clubs.

Our club recently achieved Tier 2 level acknowledgement in the *Add Your Voice* Membership campaign held by Zonta International, our five new members were entered into the register on line in the time required in May. We have had six new members in just over a year. We know that the induction is just the start. What happens after members join? Are new members happy or disappointed with their experience? What can we do better?

It is well recognised that through gathering and acting upon member feedback at all levels we can measure satisfaction and belonging with the potential of reducing member attrition. There are some key questions we can explore, and recently the club undertook a short survey of our six newest members to explore their feelings. All six responded to this 'Survey Monkey', taking an average of 4 minutes to complete. Thank you for your feedback.

It was reassuring to see that these new members all reported a high level of satisfaction, felt welcomed and had few suggestions for improvement. They used terms including – well run, respectful, friendly, caring and inspirational members, lively, interesting, varied, capable women and opportunities to be involved in the community. On the improvement side, Lesley's insistence on the microphone use at out last meeting was a direct result of survey feedback. The organisational management, friendship of members, the projects/ services that are being supported were highlighted by one respondent.

While we can be delighted about our new members, remember this was a sample of six. How do we ensure these feelings are not temporary and that members' understanding of and commitment to Zonta is nurtured?

It is up to each and every one of us to play our role in nurturing our dynamic, friendly, well organised, and productive club for the benefit of women and girls worldwide.

The first meeting of the current Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders Advocacy Group was held on Tuesday 7th September 2021 at the West Adelaide Football club. Thank you to those members who attended, Marianne, Sharon, Jenny, Kathy and Hanna. The meeting commenced with an introduction to Advocacy and the role in Zonta and the clubs goal of increasing its Advocacy profile and initiatives. Members were informed that ZCAF is a member of the Area 2 Advocacy Network and that this group meets monthly on Zoom just prior to the Combined Presidents meeting.

The Club Advocacy Goals and initial related activities:

- Engage in Advocacy activities to improve the status of Women
 - 16 Days of Activism projects in consultation with WAVAWC Clothesline Project with ZAHRA 8th November - Lesley and Lindy will represent the club at this event and potentially with the West Adelaide Football Club more information about this will be reported at the next club meeting.
 - Put up on the club Facebook page and Website initiatives and events that demonstrate the clubs involvement in promoting Advocacy activities that improve the status of women.
- Promote Advocacy through Service
 - o Working with ZAHRA undertaking Club Initiatives; Food for Thought, Sewing Project and ZAHRA Volunteers initiative.
 - Supplying toiletry bags for Women supported by Western Safety Services
- Work with likeminded organisations on issues that are of common interest.
 - o Raise awareness of Advocacy within the club and raise awareness of the District biennial plan.
 - o Work with ZAHRA on related projects eg Clothesline project 8th November
 - Membership of West Adelaide Violence against Women Collaborative
