August Meeting Guest Speaker - Emma Georgiadis: Passion to Power

Emma has spent over 15 years in the media industry, with various roles at Nova, Hit 107 and Triple M. She also undertakes freelance work as a voice over artist, MC Presenter and writer. Her tertiary accomplishments include a Bachelor of Media, Bachelor of Law and Bachelor of Education. Emma is currently undertaking further studies, to become a marriage celebrant.

As well as Emma's media industry involvement, she worked as a teacher and was responsible for developing student leaders, nationwide. She has travelled extensively, teaching in schools from Cambodia to New York to the Galapagos Islands. After ten years in the teaching domain, Emma returned her focus to media and currently works as the morning radio announcer for Triple M.

Combining her passions for communication, education and leadership, Emma has developed her own podcast 'Empowerhouse', which in her own words, is a reflection of herself. Within these podcasts, Emma interviews specific people to gain their views. She also voluntarily runs workshops through the program, "Enlighten Education", targeting young girls in private schools between the ages of 10-18, helping them to decode the mixed messages they receive and develop self-esteem and confidence. The workshops also cover managing friendships, increasing girl's sense of gratitude and becoming advocates for social change. They are encouraged to reach their own conclusions, rather than being told what to do.

To date, breast cushions have also been sent to Mt Gambier.



Combined Presidents Meeting, Saturday Morning.

On Saturday morning, the first Combined Presidents face to face meeting was held at the home of Jenni Foreman, President Zonta Club Adelaide Torrens and Area 2 Combined Advocacy Coordinator.



The meeting was chaired by Lesley Siegloff Area 2 Director and notes taken by Belinda Wise vice Area Director. Lesley welcomed all and gave a special mention of the Presidents/Vice Presidents who travelled including Belinda Wise. Lesley explained that as a past rural nurse she has a particular interest in ensuring that the rural and metropolitan club members are conscious of each other's needs.

The focus of the meeting was "Collaboration - how can we work closer together?" It was an ideal opportunity for both rural and metropolitan presidents/vice presidents of the 12 clubs who don't see each other often to talk and share issues and ideas. There was a great vibe in the room and sharing was at the fore.
