At the November 2022 meeting it was a privilege to officially welcome Claudia into the Club who has an extensive professional, educational and visual arts background.


Lindy provided the formal induction and Jill provided her with her new badge.

Clothes Line Project - Lesley Siegloff, Chair of Advocacy Group


This year the Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders again partnered with the West Adelaide Football Club (WAFC) to hold a special t-shirt painting workshop at the club as part of the 16 days of Activism Project.

It was a wonderful event to be part of with our goal to influence sports people to be aware of and call out abuse of any kind. The CEO of the WAFC, Conny Wilson and Sondra Mcginlay, Functions Coordinator of WAFC brought together a great team from the club to assist on the evening of the event. They helped set up the room including hanging clothesline cord around the restaurant, assisted with hanging the T-Shirts and as a special treat supplied the participants with pies and pasties. Besides the staff of WAFC and members of the Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders, Lindy, Kae, Jenny, Kathy, Di, Cintra, Eronwy, Julie and myself there were 5 senior male football team members and 10 female senior football team members in attendance. We also had a short visit from Pam Fletcher, President of Zonta Club Para Districts Area. It was great to share our event with her.

The event commenced with an introduction to the work of Zonta after which I introduced Derrick McManus our special guest speaker who gave a wonderful presentation about the history of the changing attitudes of domestic and family violence he experienced in his time on the Police Force and the various issues of abuse and outcomes of domestic and family violence. Derrick engaged with the participants of the event to share important knowledge and information, opening up ideas for consideration of the continuing issues in our community. Following the talk by Derrick, the participants commenced painting their ideas on the t-shirts. There was a great hum in the air as everyone chatted and shared their ideas with the result being a wonderful display of t-shirts hanging in the WAFC Restaurant.

Our thanks go to Conny and Sondra and the staff of the WAFC for the wonderful way you have supported our partnership for this event. In addition, special thanks to our members who participated on the night and supported and engaged with the footballers to produce great ideas for the t-shirt slogans.

In December 2022, we held a very successful workshop with Year 11 Walford girls, teachers and members where we successfully and enthusiastically assembled, checked, counted and packed 400 birthing kits. The birthing kits will now be shipped to Field Partners for distribution to 400 women in remote areas to enable them to experience a clean, safe birth. We will be advised in due course the destination of the birthing kits but probably will be Africa.

Many thanks to those members who supported the Assembly Day. It was a valuable learning experience for the girls, increasing their awareness of issues faced by women and children in developing countries and providing a different, meaningful project to complement their other service endeavours.


