

Feature Article: A First Timer's Experience, by Lorraine Omond

During my working life as President of the Australian Association of Public School Administrators, I was fortunate to attend and speak at many Conferences in all States of Australia so when I decided to go to the 2019 Zonta Centennial Conference in Brisbane, I thought it would be similar to past experiences.

In many aspects it was, welcomes, keynote speakers, break out sessions, the lunches, dinners, ceremonies and many people. But there were some real differences to any other Conference. The atmosphere when you walked into the Convention Centre Registration area you noticed everyone smiling, the hugs, the greetings of welcome and the rekindling of friendships from past Conferences. It soon become evident that there was a very tangible bond between attendees. We were all there in Zonta Fellowship.



I did not go far past the coffee station, when one of the Adelaide Flinders Crew corralled me through the throng to a spot in the auditorium where they had saved me a seat. It was amazing how the fantastic team stepped up so professionally and seamlessly when faced with the hospitalisation of District Governor Jane Adornetto due to an accident enroute to the conference. Dr Susan von Bassewitz, the President of Zonta International attended and had a great presence at the Conference and she was available to all and so informative.

It was during the elections that I witnessed an amazing display of courage and professionalism when dealing with a difficult decision. It was a display of true caring and compassion that just supported the dignity of the person which is paramount.

With such a plethora of speakers, ranging from Dame Quentin Bryce who surprised me with her passion, to the YWPAA speakers, the Panelists, Share your Story - all brilliant and full of ideas, to the wonderful and inspirational address by Dr Airlie Chapman. Dr Chapman's address was enthralling, and you did not want it to end - and you wished that your young grand-daughter could hear and be inspired. So many attendees wanted her book - she had to go and get more!

Breaks during the sessions were spent checking out the many amazing stalls set up by the different Clubs. The ingenuity in producing items for sale were wide ranging and showed incredible innovation and skills. Some Clubs had the same stall each year as the items that they produced were in demand - predominantly jewelry.

When the Conference came to an end, I remember feeling so small as one individual but really empowered to be part of such a focused, dynamic group of women.

Advocacy Committee Report, from Leann Symonds ZCFP

Area 2 will be holding another combined Advocacy meeting soon with a focus on collaborative work with services and organisations that focus on **Housing Stress and Homelessness**.

The general profile of households in housing stress and at risk of homelessness has changed, widening to take in those who have not experienced issues in the past. At the recent meeting the following statistics



were provided which gave an insight at the demographics and highlighted that women and children are most at risk and as such an advocacy issue fits well with the objectives of Zonta.

Of the 278,300 clients agencies assisted in 2020-21:

- 6 in 10 were female (60% or 176,400 clients)
- 1 in 6 were children under the age of 10 (16% or 44,200 clients)
- 1 in 8 were children and youth aged 10-17 (12% or 34,300 clients)
- The largest age group of adult clients were aged 25-34 (18% of all clients or 51,900 clients)
- About 13,300 were women aged 55 or older (8% of total female clients) and 10,600 were men aged 55 or older (9.5% of total male clients)
- 1 in 3 (33% or 84,900 clients) were living in single parent with 1 or more children families when they sought support (AIWH 2021a).

Australians known to be at particular risk of homelessness include those who have experience family and domestic violence, young people, children on care and protection orders, Indigenous Australians, people leaving health or social care arrangements and Australians aged 55 or older.

In 2020-21, about 91,400 clients had experienced family and domestic violence at some point during the reporting period. Some client groups were more likely to be experiencing homelessness than other groups at the beginning of their support. In particular, young people aged 15-24 presenting alone (51%), clients with current mental health issues (50%) and children on care and protection orders (50%).

It is proposed that the Area 2 strategy will be to look at groups and organisations that can effectively work together to make a difference. If any member wishes to be part of the next Advocacy meeting, please discuss the opportunity with your Co-Presidents.


