There was a lot of talk about what we are doing, the activities focused on and the expected outcomes. There was a particular interest in how our Club was operating with a 'two for one' Co-Presidents system and it caused us to reflect on how we have approached this role. An important part of working together is to be able to critically evaluate how we work, with respect, transparency, honesty and to do this in the spirit of Zonta.

We are now both back in the land of Oz and would particularly like to thank our very capable Vice President, Eronwy Edwards, for her wonderful support in filling in for us both and Isobel McFarlane who quietly and efficiently provided magnificent back-up. It is good to be home and we have certainly returned to what is a very busy period in October and November.

Lindy attended an Area 2 Presidents Meeting late September where there was much discussion on how to attract and keep a diversity of members. It was agreed that a 'Greater Inclusion' session would be valuable lesson in our next Workshop. The next workshop in May 2024 has been moved from Pt Lincoln to Adelaide. It will be a combined Clubs effort.

16 days of Activism is shaping up to be a very busy time for all Area 2 clubs with some exciting activities being presented. Lesley has encouraged us all to get as many members as possible to register and join the walk on 25th November that we have partnered with Rotary Club. Please review the list of activities that have been planned on Page 8 and participate if you can.

We had three submissions in for the Service Community Awards - SA (SCASA) which recognise the efforts of Service Clubs in South Australia. A group of nine members attended the luncheon on 29th October 2023 and we were thrilled that we received commendations for our Clothesline Project (\$100 prize) and the Woman of Inspiration Award (\$200 prize). However, the highlight of the day was that Jill Welsh won the Heidi Taylor Award for Service (against a very strong competition).

Jill's contribution to Zonta over 40 years has been outstanding and her continued contribution to Zonta and in particular our Club is what has allowed us to continue supporting the values and spirit of Zonta. Jill has held positions of President, Vice President, Board Member and Lead of Membership for more than 15 years. In addition, Jill has received a number of recognition awards including 'Award of Excellence' and the 'International President's Distinguished Club Service Award' - this highest accolade for a Club. Jill has been a driving force For our fund-raising efforts with particular success with our renown annual Movie Night which has raised over \$100,000 in 38 years. Jill also has gone above and



beyond in securing a benefactor (in perpetuity) for Zonta Club of Adelaide Flinders 'Woman of Inspiration Awards'. This award celebrates 2-3 women each year who has experienced some form of adversity and, in spite of this, have risen above expectations and inspired other women.

We all would like to say thank you Jill and Congratulations on your recognition.

We are looking forward to the 16 Days of Activism and have received quite a number of invitations to attend other Club's Events. The National Council of Women have extended an invitation to attend a Presidents Function in November, and the list goes on.

Your support of our Club's Clothesline Event 'Drawing the Line' at the West Adelaide Football Club on Tuesday 28th November at 5.45pm will be an acknowledgement of the great work our Advocacy Group has been doing. Report from the Biennial Conference - Lorraine Omond

Good news - we all made it. Good flights, but a long drive. Some of us did the short trip from Perth to Bunbury, others a little longer but it was a good drive.

First day registrations commenced at 12 noon, tables filled for dinner, we got a free drink voucher and delegates were all signed in (25 attended with 33 registered). Electronic voting accounting for the differences. There were 130 registered attendees making for a great atmosphere.



After general housekeeping, Sandra Burns opened the conference and introduced Candidates for D23 Board. We had video presentations from Jenni Trewen and Lindy Berketa who gave wonderful presentations. Area 2 are going to have really great leaders in the next Biennium!

Kay Stewart (Governor) welcomed all members and guests and declared the meeting open.

This was special, as the last conference held here was exactly 20 years ago when the Birthing Kits Project started. There were five nominees for the nominating Committee. Our member Lesley gave a fantastic 2 minute professional dissertation. Members were advised that no nominations from floor had been received so the slate stood as is. Delegates were able to vote with a link being sent. Our Club's voting preferences made the job of Delegate very easy and I am pleased to report that the election results for the D23 Board were exactly as you had wanted. Debbie Schmidt is Governor; Lieutenant Governor Wendy Quinn, Chris Fric, District Treasurer and Area 1 Director; Fiona MacDowell, Area 2 Director; Jennifer Trewren-Forman, Vice Area 2 Director; and our own Lindy Berketa, Area 3 Director; Donna Fabris, Area 4 Director and Jill Taylor Area 5 Director. The Nominating Committee includes Pru Blackwell, Faith O'Brien and our own Lesley Siegloff.

Phyllis presented the Welcome to Country and we had a very inspirational rendition of 'I am Woman" by quite a number of women's choral clubs all over Australia.

The Mayor of Bunbury, gave an entertaining welcome to Bunbury - great to see younger person with so much vitality in this position. He declared our Conference open.

Thirty first timers were welcomed as was the new E-Club of Central and Southern Australia.

Annika Branstrom, Director Zonta International and Zonta Foundation for Women (from Sweden) was welcomed. A very approachable and informative ZI representative. Annika brought messages from Ute Scholz our ZI President and also gave us a great session on the proposed Strategic Plan to be presented to Convention in 2024. Looking forward to seeing her again in Brisbane next year.

Day one had some very thought-provoking speakers. Natalie Isaacs, the founder of '1 Million Women' shared her inspirations and aspirations which were contained in her published works (refer to the website at http://www.1millionwomen.com.au).

The 2023 WA Australian of the Year Prof. Samar Aoun provided us with approaches to palliative care - and the need to just be there for the person in need.

On day two we were privileged to hear from two speakers. WA being into mining, Megan McCracken allowed us to look at her life experiences from a child of the bush with books into the beefy hard hat area of mining. A long and fascinating journey. Then Kristi McVee, a retired specialist child interviewer brought a chilling reminder to us about the trauma of child sexual abuse, to the child, the family, support workers and the interviewer. An impactful reminder of the times we live in and our responsibility to listen to our children. Her book 'Operation Kidsafe' is a must read.

The youthful energy abounded in spades - Amy Zahra who was the '2022 JM Klausman Women in Business' winner, a single mum who showed us - Yes, I Can Do It!

Phoebe Bourke - D23 2023 YWPA winner showed us how her leadership, combined with empathy, respect and commitment made her a worthy winner. Bella Burgemeister, an author at the age of 10, showing how she could make a difference relating to the younger generation of climate action. Bubbly Alexis (Lexy) McDonald entered the world of coding and eventually with much perseverance created an app HerHelp - at a cost of 2.2 million she managed to source this money as well. Now at 21 - has her own company.

Dinner on the hill - a wild, windy, woolly night full of laughter, music and frivolity thanks to the wonderful host Club of Bunbury.

A very sobering time - the Ceremony of Remembrance was a very reflective time remembering those Zontians who had passed during this Biennium. The harpist and the yellow roses were very reflective of the esteem in which these late members were held.

Birthing Kits, exciting times ahead whereby we can take up the use of tax deductibility now on offer. Now for the exciting news - certificates were given out to Clubs who had held the most numbers of birthing kit assembly days. Silver, lots of them, Gold two - ONE WAS US!

Then a platinum - So we were the third highest. Great Job Adelaide Flinders guided by Sue Lear.

Years of service awards were read out and we had 5 members from 20 to 40 years presented with their service medals - well done ladies.

A young Zontians Forum was an amazing insight of how the Z Clubs can flourish in schools. The requirements being a focused facilitator that can channel the unlimited energy of these wonderful young women.

The D23 Awards - Congratulations to our wonderful PR and Communications teams- we received a Highly Commended Award acknowledging all your great work.

Then we received the news - we won the Award for Women of Inspiration. Jill and I just hugged as our group cheered. A wonderful award for the work that our Club has put into setting up this project.

Sewing Circle:

The Sewing Circle project is reviewing the opportunities to enhance membership and support and further discussions will be held in the new year.

Breast Cushions:

Our commitment to suporting key Breast Care Nurses in both metropolitan and rural locations in the provision of breast care cushions will continue as a prioirty. Sarah Cunnigham has advised that there is a number of new hospitals that are now doing breast surgery so she has been supporting a number of additional 'sewing and stuffing' workshops.

October is breast cancer awareness month so it is timely to remind family, friends and colleagues to have their mammograms (Breastscreen 132050)

To date our Club has donated over 6,300 cushions!

Workshops at the Reynella Neighbourhood Centre (located at 164 Old South Rd, Old Reynella) will be held on Thursday 30th November and then in 2024 the workshops will be held every other month on the last Thursday commencing 29th February 2024.

Our own club members are continuing to make breast care cushions and the outsourcing of cushions to the Marion Quilters is continuing. We are also very grateful to 3 more individuals who are collecting batches to make cushions.

The annual Walford Workshop is to be held in December 2023 and Sue Lear is confirming the date; any members wishing to participate will be very welcome.


