Our Annual Breast Cushion and Birthing Kit Workshop with the Year 10 girls at Walford on 7<sup>th</sup> December was again another great opportunity to connect and engage with young women, to talk about the many issues concerning women as we travel through life. Small opportunity but big steps forward!

Thank you to Jenni Foreman for the detailed flyer we received, showing all the events planned by our sister Clubs. We do hope you were able to attend one or two of them.

National Council of Women lighted up the town on 6<sup>th</sup> December and again Adelaide Oval will be the first to turn Orange! Another reminder that Zonta says NO!

#### Guest Speaker - November Meeting, Samson Selladurai

Samson is a serial entrepreneur, pioneering many ventures in both the business and missional world. He mentors many budding professionals and students and his connections with well known social and business leaders across countries, are his strengths. An alumnus of University of South Australia, completing his Masters in International Business in 2008 and attended the prestigious Lachlan Macquarie Internship in Canberra in 2013, whereby leaders are trained in politics and public policy.



In 2019, Samson and his brother, cofounded the safety application for women, 'I'm Safe Women Safety App' - a platform that delivers an effective and free solution to women's safety. 'I'm Safe' is a phone application whereby during an emergency or when someone is hesitant to call law enforcement, allows close contacts to be notified for help.

Features of the application include:

- Sharing your location with loved ones by updating when and where you are in real time.
- SOS sends out alerts to all your trusted contacts.
- Shares your location, photograph and records audio clips.

Upcoming features include:

- I'm Safe Social connect with others who share similar interests.
- Safety Marker provides an overview of the safest and most dangerous areas in a city.
- I'm Safe Helpline confidential support to anyone feeling unsafe, staffed by trained professionals.
- I'm Safe Quick Tips advice on personal safety and cyber safety.
- I'm Safe Chat keeps in touch with family and friends. Creates groups and allows you to share photos and videos.
- I'm Safe Market Place allows you to buy and sell through a safe "woman" environment.

Samson is passionate about getting the **I'm Safe Women Safety App** out into the broader community and devotes his own time in promoting the application to both the business and domestic world.

#### Annual Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast - November 2023

On 16 November 2023 several of our members were present at the annual Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast at the Convention Centre which was attended by around 700 guests.

The guest speaker was Ms Micaela Cronin, Australia's inaugural Commissioner for Domestic, Family and Sexual Violence who travelled from Canberra for the event.

It was an absolute privilege to be able to hear her speak at Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast. In 2014, Ms Cronin was awarded the Robin Clark Leadership Award which recognises a leader who inspires others in achieving the best outcome for children, young people and their families.

Our own member Cintra Amos was Co-Convenor for the event and is pictured with past D23 Governor, Jane Smith.





# 16 Days of Activism - Lesley Siegloff

A big thank you to our club members, family and friends who supported our program of events to start the conversations within our communities about 'NO TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN'. I would like to say thank you to the organisations and businesses that 'hosted' our very own 'Orange Ladies'. The concept of 'pop-up' discussions at café's and gyms were great initiatives by one of our members and we will certainly look forward to expanding other business in our next years program.



25<sup>th</sup> November is the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, which coincides with the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence and runs through 10 December Human Rights Day. It is the start of our Zonta Says 'NO TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN' campaign for 2023.

We have heard of the horrendous statistics of at least one woman a week being killed by a partner in Australia and disturbingly in South Australia 6 more women have died as a result of partner violence in the last month. As a Club we would like to acknowledge these women and all the other women, men and children who have and are suffering from family and domestic violence.

Through the Zonta Says 'NO TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN' campaign, Zonta clubs around the world are uniting to raise their voices to bring awareness to this issue and advocate on behalf of gender-based violence survivors. We advocate for equity, education, an end to child marriage and gender-based violence.

We are lending our voice to the call for a world where women's rights are recognised as human rights. Here in South Australia it is a pleasure to be working and collaborating with a range of organisations such as Zahra Foundation, National Council of Women (SA), Western Collaborative against family and domestic abuse, Soroptimists International, Women's Shelters, city councils and more recently Rotary.

This year Zonta is again with our partners advocating for an improvement in the circumstances which are among those that continue to put more and more women at risk including homelessness and coercive control.

Coercive control is an under-reported type of domestic violence where an abuser seeks to control a victim's behaviour. Whilst coercive control is not currently a standalone offence in South Australia, we are encouraged that the SA Government has drafted the Criminal Law Consolidation (Coercive Control) Amendment Bill 2023, which creates a new criminal offence of coercive control. Zonta is looking forward to this legislation being passed soon, resulting in the criminalisation of coercive control.

#### That will be one step forward.

On 24 November 2023, Zonta along with Embolden, Zahra Foundation and many other likeminded organisations called on the SA Government to hold a Royal Commission into Domestic Violence. Zonta in South Australia supports this call and asks that the government implement a Commission quickly so that the outcomes and recommendations can be acted upon and funded in a timely and positive manner.

Zonta will continue its work to advocate for a better world for women and girls. This will include calling on members of the community to show respect to each other and demonstrate to our children and other adult's respectful behaviours.

# Sewing Circle:

The Sewing Circle project is reviewing the opportunities to enhance membership and support. Further discussions will be held in the new year.

#### **Breast Cushions:**

Our commitment to suporting key Breast Care Nurses in both metropolitan and rural locations in the provision of breast care cushions will continue as a prioirty. Sarah Cunnigham has advised that there is a number of new hospitals that are now doing breast surgery so she has been supporting a number of additional 'sewing and stuffing' workshops.

The annual Walford Workshop was held on 7th December 2023. Students were enthusiastic, eager to learn machine sewing and some were already maters of hand sewing which was fantastic. A total of 92 cushions were completed and wrapped and a further 12 are ready for final stuffing.

Do you have any suitable material? - let me know if you might have some! (heavier satins, smooth / not scratchy unbacked curtain material, cottons Ok if soft. Avoid very pale colours, or stretchy or slinky as too hard to cut & sew!)

## Birthing Kits:

The annual Walford Workshop was held on 7<sup>th</sup> December for the assembling of birthing kits. The 30 Year 11 students were so enthusiatic and focused with brilliant attention to detail which resulted in 600 kits being completed. The Birthing Kits have now been dispatched to BKFA for distribution.

We will be receiving a donation of \$1,000 towards the cost of the kits from the proceeds of 4 beautiful baskets that were prepared and raffled by the student - what a fantastic effort.
